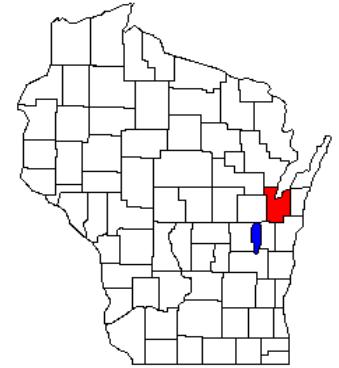

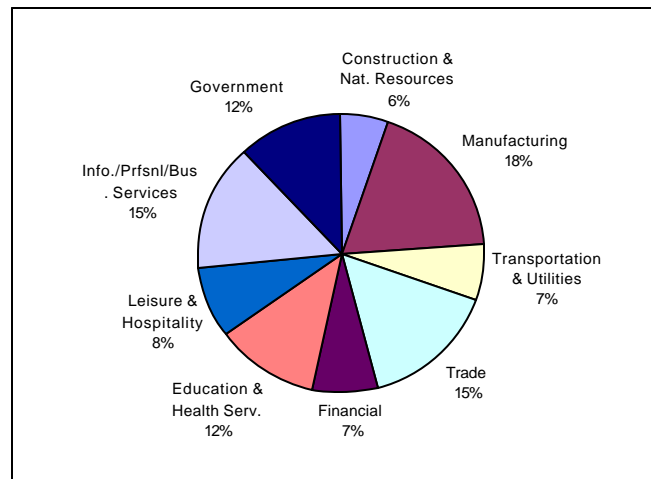


Brown County...

is one of about four counties in the State of Wisconsin that has more jobs, than it has workers in its labor force. The need for workers is filled by residents of the surrounding counties. Every day thousands of workers from neighboring counties travel to jobs in Brown County and join the thousands of resident workers at some of the county's largest employers.

Many of those jobs are with the manufacturing, insurance, and health care employers that provide almost 45 percent of the jobs in the county. Manufacturing employment is the largest industry sector with 18.5 percent of the county's employment. This is down from just over 20 percent 2 years ago.

Employment by Industry in Brown County: 2002



The annual average wage in 2001 from employers in the larger major industry sectors was \$39,276 in manufacturing, \$42,876 in transportation, and \$34,548 in finance, insurance and real estate. The annual average wage from all employers was \$32,551, roughly 105.3 percent of the average wage for all workers in the state of \$30,922.

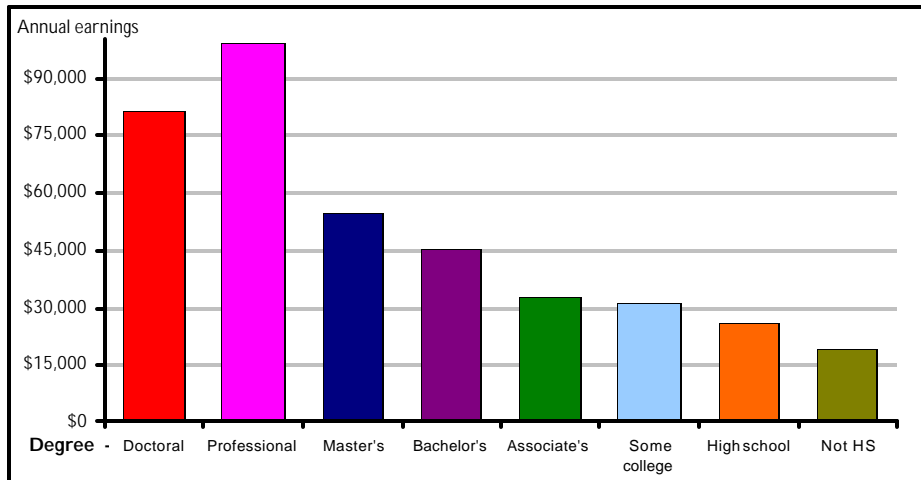
